- (3) Concerning material(s):

- (d) a substance for which there are Europe-wide workplace exposure limits.

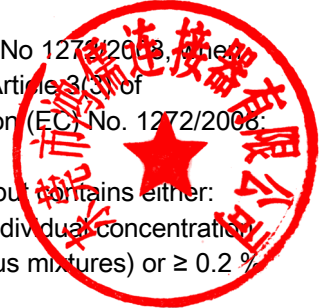

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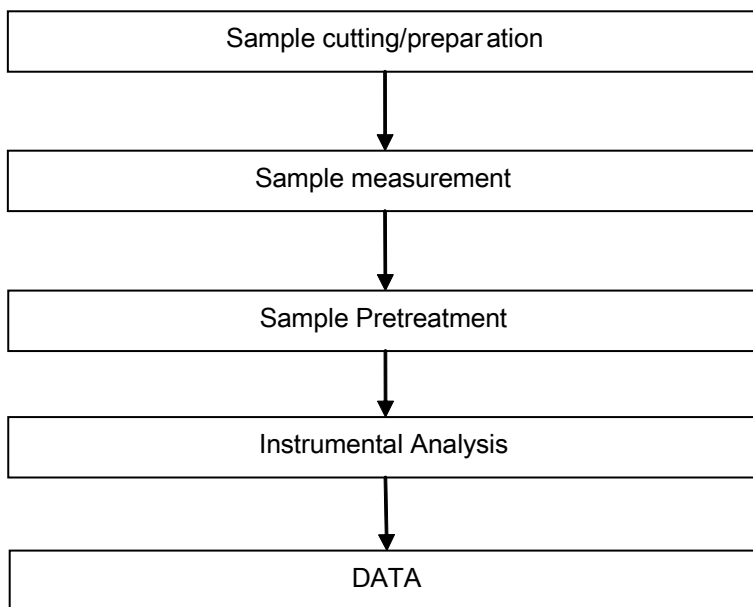
